Management of Domestic Incidents

HSPD-5 Objectives:

- Single comprehensive national approach
 - Prevention, Preparedness, Response and Recovery
- Ensure all levels of government and private sector work together
- Integrate crisis and consequence management
- DHS Secretary as the principal Federal official


HSPD-5 Implementation

Develop and administer:

- National Incident Management System (NIMS)
 - Core set of concepts, principles and terminology for incident command and multi-agency coordination
- National Response Plan (NRP)
 - All-discipline, all-hazards plan
 - Initial National Response Plan (INRP) created as an interim plan until the publication of the full NRP

Standardized process and procedures for incident management

Initial NRP

INITIAL NATIONAL RESPONSE PLAN

September 30, 2003

U.S. Department of Homeland Security

- Issued September 30, 2003
- Interim Plan Bridging document to full NRP
 - Use existing plans (FRP, FRERP, etc.)
 - Harmonizes existing operational processes, procedures and protocols
- Defines DHS elements
 - Principal Federal Official (PFO)
 - Interagency Incident Management Group (IIMG)
 - Homeland Security Operations Center (HSOC)
 - Joint Field Office (JFO)
- Requires modifications to existing plans

National Incident Management System (NIMS)

- Provides the national standard for incident management
- Based on the National Interagency Incident Management System (NIIMS) Incident Command System (ICS)
- Approved/published in March 2004
- Major components:
 - Incident Command and Management
 - Preparedness
 - Resource Management
 - Communications and Information Management
 - Supporting Technologies
 - Ongoing Management and Maintenance

Command & Management

- Incident Command System (ICS): Management system designed to integrate resources from numerous organizations into a single response structure using common terminology and processes
- Incident management activities organized under five functions:

Command

Operations

Planning

Logistics

Finance

 Unified Command incorporates Federal, State, Tribal, Local and non-governmental entities with overlapping jurisdiction and incident management responsibilities

NIMS Integration Center

Development and maintenance of:

- National-level training standards and course curricula
- Materials supporting NIMS implementation (training modules, job aids, etc.)
- Documentation and database system for qualification, certification and credentialing of incident management personnel and responders
- System related to standards for performance, compatibility and interoperability of equipment
- Repository for lessons learned



NRP Applicability/Scope

- National framework for domestic incident management
- Broadly applies to all incident categories
- Establishes incident monitoring and reporting protocols
- Incidents of National Significance:
 - DHS lead for Operational coordination; and/or
 - Resource coordination

Organization of the NRP



NRP Concept of Operations

- Single national framework for various Federal roles:
 - Direct implementation of Federal authorities
 - Federal to State support
 - Federal to Federal support
 - Pro-active response to catastrophic incidents
- Incidents handled at lowest possible organizational level
- DHS receives notification, assesses regional or national implications and determines need for DHS coordination
- DHS operational and/or resource coordination for Incidents of National Significance

Nuclear/ Radiological Response Incident Annex

- Annex provides organized, integrated capability for Federal-level response to nuclear and/or radiological incidents
- Scope: Incident (natural disaster, accident, terrorist, etc.) with actual, potential, or perceived radiological consequences (domestic) that could require response by the Federal government (excluding war)
- Implementation:
 - Integral element of National Response Plan; or
 - Stand-alone Federal interagency protocol for incidents below threshold of "incident of national significance"
- Supercedes Federal Radiological Emergency Response Plan (FRERP)
- Creates no new authorities; changes no existing authorities

Nuclear Regulatory Commission Roles/Responsibilities

NRC & Department of Homeland Security (DHS) Interfaces under National Response Plan

- Tabletop Exercise NRC staff and DHS management
- Clarify NRC & DHS roles/responsibilities for incidents involving NRC-regulated facilities and materials
- Nuclear plants "accident" & "terrorist" scenarios
- Scenario-based "question & answer" discussions
- Tabletop Model for other Federal agencies

Nuclear Regulatory Commission Roles/Responsibilities

DHS Recognition:

- NRC's statutory authorities relative to incident response
- NRC's lead role relative to plume modeling/analysis
- NRC's lead role relative to protective action recommendations
- NRC's existing relationship with licensees

NRC & DHS Confirmation:

- DHS's lead role for <u>coordination</u> of overall Federal response
- DHS lead responsibilities for "incidents of national significance"

Nuclear Regulatory Commission NRP Participation & Outreach

- Commission-level participation in NRP development process
- Homeland Security Council interagency policy coordination
- Nuclear/Radiological Response Incident Annex writing team
- Revision of NRC plans/procedures (e.g., NUREG-0728, Incident Response Plan)
- Roll out of INRP outreach included information dissemination
 + stakeholder meeting
- Roll out of NRP + Annexes outreach to include information dissemination + Regional workshops (October 2004)
