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National Incident Management System

“...a consistent nationwide approach for federal, state, tribal, and local governments to work effectively and efficiently together to prepare for, prevent, respond to, and recover from domestic incidents, regardless of cause, size, or complexity.”

-HSPD-5



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National Response Plan

The National Response Plan is built on the template of the National Incident Management System. It provides the structure and mechanisms for coordinating federal support to state, local and tribal incident managers ...

And for exercising direct federal authorities and responsibilities.

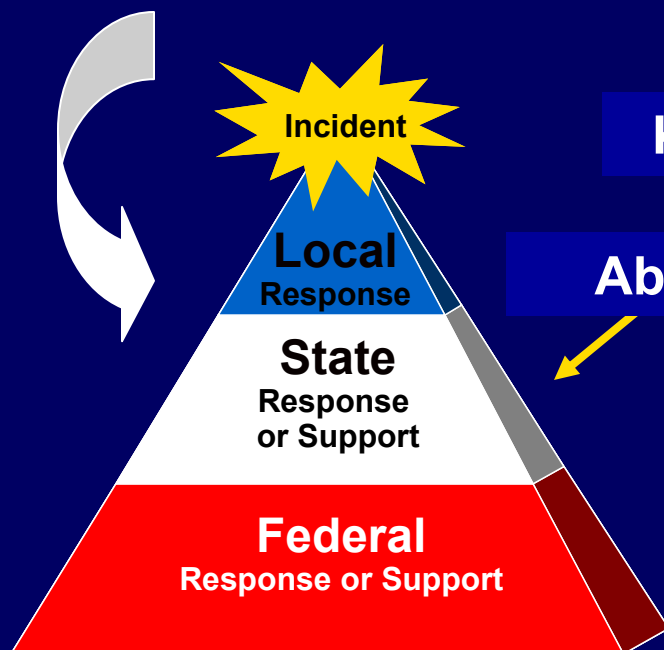


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Relationship: NIMS and NRP

NIMS

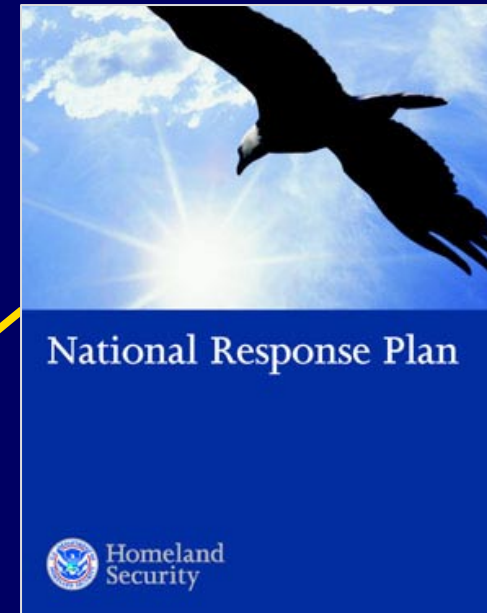
- Aligns command, control, organization structure, terminology, communication protocols and resources/resource-typing

- Integrates and applies federal resources, knowledge, and abilities before, during and after incidents

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NIMS Implementation

- FY 2005 Implementation Guidance
 - Letters to Federal Departments and Agencies
 - Memo to DHS Directorates and offices
 - Letter to Governors
- To the maximum extent possible, States, territories, tribes, and local entities are encouraged to achieve full NIMS implementation and institutionalization across the entire response system during FY 2005
- In order for NIMS to be implemented successfully across the nation, it is critical that States provide support and leadership to tribal and local entities to ensure full NIMS implementation



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Federal Compliance in FY 2005

-Letter from Secretary Ridge to Federal Agencies, September 8, 2004

- Identify existing or anticipated preparedness assistance programs, including grants or contracts that contribute to building preparedness and response capabilities.
- Submit a plan for adopting and implementing the NIMS.
- Incorporate the NIMS into Emergency Operations Plans.
